President's Message

There is not much more I can say about the ongoing Lyon Park centennial celebration than "Wow!" The events so far have been a resounding success, even though Mother Nature hasn't been as kind as she could be. Hats off to Natalie Roy, Bill Anhut, Sky Adler, Darcy Rosenbaum, Paul Showalter, and Aaron Schuetz for spearheading these events. Of course, they wouldn't have been able to pull them off without the assistance of countless other volunteers. They set the bar awfully high for those tasked to mark the next historical milestone for our community.

While the fun is fleeting and memories of the events will soon fade, the Centennial Historical Committee, led by Thora Colot, has made sure the centennial celebration will be remembered for years to come. They have encapsulated the rich history of Lyon Park, from the earliest Native American settlers to the present day, in a series of banners that now hang in the Community Center sunroom. It is quite an impressive display, and I encourage you to take time to enjoy the fruits of their labor the next time you are at the center.

Unfortunately, the lead up to the centennial events was marred by an ugly incident in our community park. In late September, several nannies were watching their wards in the park, when a woman passing by took offense at the fact they were speaking in Spanish, and started hurling racist insults at them. When one of the nannies started capturing the verbal assault on her cell phone, the woman picked up a large plastic toy and hurled it at her. Although the nanny was hit, she was not injured. It is hard to believe that the woman, who was charged by Arlington County Police, hasn't gotten the message posted in front yards across our community -- Hate Has No Home Here!

However, that was not always the case, as our final centennial celebration event will underscore. Christa Abbott has organized a community conversation on the legacy of racial covenants in Lyon Park, which will be held as part of our monthly meeting on Wednesday, November 13. Lindsey Bestebreutje, whose doctoral dissertation examined the development of the African-American community in Arlington County, will lead the conversation. Please plan to attend.



He was just taking his wife Jean around, showing her where he grew up.

He went to kindergarten here in the Community Center

in 1942, Henry Clay School for his elementary years, and Washington Lee (Liberty) for high school. He served in the Air Force for awhile, became a flight instructor and was

stationed in the Panama Canal Zone for a long period of time. He and a few friends built a private air strip there on a very informal basis. He published a book "Unusual Attitudes- A Flight Instructor's Memoirs of the US Panama Canal Zone" which is a really interesting read partly because of its unusual candor, wit, and humor. Its chock full of photos—many aerials naturally—and if you forgot about the white Go-Go Boots of the 70s, this should bring it back.

Cathell Team Repeats as 2019 Tourney Champions!!!

A record number—39 players—participated in the 2019 Lyon Park/Ashton Heights Golf Tourney at South Riding Golf Club on Sunday October 13, 2019. Two teams tied for first place. Lyon Parker Chris O'Donnell and her team including Ellen Manges, and Tracey Switzer shot a sixteen-under par 56, as did the Ashton Heights team of Ron Cathell, Tim Anderson, Al Johnson, and Sabino Molina. However, the Cathell team won the tie-breaker and the 2019 Championship trophy by tie-breaker rules. Greg and Henry Bramham, Bobby Hong, and Wally Hays finished 3rd, a stroke back at fifteen under par.

Individual prizes of \$50 gift certificates donated by our sponsors were awarded to closest to pin and long drive winners, Ellen Manges (twice!) Al Johnson, Greg Bramham, Mike Pohl, and Gregg Siegal. Tracey Switzer won the Putt-off (and two dozen Pro V1x golf balls) by sinking her 35 foot putt before everyone else.

This year's golf tourney raised \$2,600 which will be used to help fund the Lyon Park Community Center's Legacy Endowment. The golf tourney has raised \$19,150 over its nine-year history.












The Wright Brothers

Most anyone with an engineering background will enjoy reading McCullough's detailed account of Wilbur and Orville Wright 's efforts to create the first airplanes. McCullough has done a tremendous amount of research, integrating primary and secondary sources of information, with 32 pages of interesting photos and 32 pages of footnotes.

What strikes the more casual reader is the intensity and dedication of both Wrights, as well as that of their sister Katherine, to an arduous and uncertain project. This family was religious, their father a bishop, but religious in a practical, integrated way. They were devoted to their family and to each other. They did not work on Sundays, were tranquil of spirit and dedicated to discovering the mysteries of practical aero-dynamics. Even at the height of their international fame and popularity, with tens of thousands on both sides of the Atlantic, including royalty, coming to see them, demanding to see them, the Wrights maintained their social countenance as unprepossessing Ohio boys.

Essentially by studying the flight of birds and then using hand crafted gliders, the Wrights moved toward a flying machine. Their self-discipline, their devotion, their open-mindedness and their attention to detail, continually refining pieces and processes, 'gave' them their dreamed of aircraft. Ironically one pundit noted that before the Wrights no one could fly but after the Wrights anyone could fly (but only because the Wrights made it look easy having already invested years of detailed work).

Another point of contrast is that the Wrights used their personal finances (about \$1,000 over the years) and succeeded whereas Langley, a competitor who had the backing of the USG and the Smithsonian including a budget of \$70,000, failed.

In May of 1912, at the age of 45, worn out defending Wright patents from infringements, Wilbur contracted typhoid fever and died. McCullough points out that Orville lived to see 'the horrific death and destruction wrought by the giant bombers of WWII.' Orville outlived Wilbur by 37 years, both convinced that flying answered a call in man's soul.

Clay Park: Getting a Facelift

The reconstruction of Clay Park will commence Oct. 21 and take 12 months. The complete revamp will provide new equipment in two resituated playgrounds, a new shelter, more seating, a grass playing field, a basketball court, new plantings, and more. The cost is \$1.44 million.

People and Pup Walk-Abouts (Chapter 3)

Now, that you've sampled some of the best of Northern Virginia's dog walking spots, it could be time to expand your horizons to the other side of the Potomac. Some of these spots are probably familiar in name but may have seemed too far away to be tempting. However, once you have ventured there you'll find that they are well worth the trip for human and pup alike—new sights and smells for the adventurous and a way to leave the city behind for the rush- and crowd-weary.

Rock Creek Park is an amazing urban treasure running right up the middle of northwest DC to Maryland. There are many trails, picnic areas and parklets along its length. A very helpful guide to the park's riches is https://tinyurl.com/yxfh7dnq. Another excellent resource is https://tinyurl.com/yyyef6q6. One of Matthew and Seven's favorite easy-to-get-to starting points is Peirce Mill at Tilden St., NW and Beach Dr. Find it and other Rock Creek Park advice on one of these two websites. During warm weather weekends some parts of Rock Creek Parkway are open to bike or pedestrian traffic only. Lane closures also occur during rush hours and for maintenance so always check on current conditions before setting out.

One of the loveliest nature preserves, "an oasis in the city," is *Tregaron Conservancy*. It also has a beautiful and richly informative website at https://tinyurl.com/y22cnvcj that tells everything you need to know to tempt you to check it outparking, access, history and philosophy.


The 7-mile Capital Crescent Trail is a lesser known walking/biking option that begins at the Potomac Boat Club in Georgetown and continues out to Bethesda. The lower level trail is unpaved and the upper is paved. Watch for cyclists especially on the paved trail. A helpful website for first-hand information and commentary on this trail is https://www.cctrail.org/access. Park and walk as far as you wish and then turn around and enjoy what you missed on the way in.


Dumbarton Oaks Park is another jewel of nature at the northern edge of Georgetown. The website is a complete guide for visitors to the Park, including pups: https://dopark.org/visit-2/. It's a naturalistic retreat to be savored in many visits at many different times of year.

And last, another garden spot deserving of many visits is the *US National Arboretum*, a research facility of the US Department of Agriculture off of New York Ave., NE. 
